





Bound for Las Vegas: where clean air moves forward

In an era of unprecedented demand, the clean energy industry is converging in the US this September to accelerate innovation, forge powerful partnerships and chart the course for a smarter, more resilient grid.

Taking place from 8th to 11th September, 2025, at The Venetian Expo & Caesars FORUM, RE+ 25 is North America's largest and most comprehensive clean energy event. She'll serve as the attendees' guide, setting the stage for RE+ 25, a week designed to equip you and your network with the insights, education and networking you need to accelerate our industry.

From there, the event unfolds into four days of immersive learning, business opportunities, networking and exploration. Whether you're seeking solutions for your company, technical knowledge, market insights, policy updates or simply face time with colleagues and clients, there is something for every corner of the clean energy economy.

Full Conference Passholders will gain exclusive access to eight concurrent education tracks, the Main Stage, and for the first time in 2025, the Full Conference Lounge, a comfortable retreat onsite for private conversations, a moment to recharge, or catching up on emails over coffee. The educational content this year reflects the full scope of issues driving and challenging the clean energy transition. Topics include regulatory reform and utility engagement, transmission and interconnection, cybersecurity risks, long-duration storage, hydrogen development, community engagement and ESG and workforce strategies. Tracks are designed to appeal across job functions, from technical experts and engineers to project developers. installers, manufacturers, executives and policymakers.

Session formats are as varied as the content itself. Attendees can choose from panels, Energy Exchanges, QuickTalks, Deep Dives and RE+ Tech sessions. Whether you prefer a deep technical dive, a collaborative brainstorming session or a quick hit of insights, the flexibility of content makes it possible to learn on your terms.

And this year, the event is making Monday more valuable than ever. For the first time,



Monday Deep Dives, will focus on business-critical topics like sales, cybersecurity, workforce development and communications, offering a focused start to the week's programming for those looking to zero in on key business challenges.

Adding to the depth of the experience, the conference includes two days of hands-on workshops on Monday and Thursday, designed for attendees seeking advanced instruction and real-world application. These workshops require an additional ticket and cover everything from microgrid deployment and grid integration to PV policy, permitting and system operations.

While much of the focus is on the US market, the event's global perspective continues to grow. In 2025, it will proudly feature Denmark as the Spotlight Country, co-hosted by Danish Energy Export.

Denmark is widely regarded as a clean energy pioneer, having built world-leading offshore wind capacity and made major advances in hydrogen infrastructure, district heating, and grid modernization. With a national goal of achieving 100% renewable electricity by 2030 and climate neutrality by 2050, Denmark exemplifies the kind of cross-sector ambition this event exists to promote.

From innovative solar tracking systems and advanced batteries to drones and robotics, EV charging networks and
